On Tuesday, May 7, 2019, the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB) released its Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) to implement the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA). The proposed rules recommend significant changes to the form and manner of debt collector communications to consumers, credit reporting and litigation activity.
