Insights into the Consumer Debt Default Judgments Act February 21 – 9:00am PT/12:00pm ET One (1) RMAI Education Credit

This past July the Uniform Law Commission adopted the Consumer Debt Default Judgments Act.

The Act would materially modify existing procedures for obtaining default judgments on many types of consumer debt, including new notice requirements and the inclusion of certain documents and data in judgment applications. On February 13, 2024, a bill was introduced in Colorado that would adopt the Act, and it is anticipated several states will follow.

Our panel includes Raymond Pepe, Esq, who chaired the committee that drafted the Act. The panel also includes Franci Wayland of PRA and Don Maurice, RMAI's outside counsel. They will discuss RMAI's role in the drafting of the Act and, in particular, how the Act aligns with RMAI Receivables Management Certification Program standards.
